Referral Process FAQs

Who can refer students for Highly Capable testing?

Anyone may refer a student for the Highly Capable Program. Referrals can come from parents, teachers, school specialists, friends, family, community members, or the student themselves.

What is the referral timeline?

The referral forms for the 2022-2023 school year placements will be available online and in school offices October through December. Parent referrals MUST be physically in (not just postmarked by) to Wendy Clark, Highly Capable Coordinator, prior to **December 10, 2021**. There will be no exceptions to this date.

How do families refer and give permission for program?

Parents/guardians wishing to refer their child for testing needs to complete a Parent Referral and Permissions Packet for the student to possibly be further tested based on the decision of the Multidisciplinary Selection Committee (MSC). All referred students will be screened through this committee. Parents will sign a separate letter for permission to place in program if further evidence deems identification as Highly Capable.

How do staff members refer and/or provide feedback?

Teachers, or other staff members, complete a Staff Referral and Feedback Packet for every student referred by a family member, or that they feel may qualify for Highly Capable services. These forms will be available to teachers online.

Please let your student's teacher know if you are completing a referral form so they know to complete their necessary forms as well.

ALL referral forms must be in our possession by December 10, 2021.

<u> Assessments & Selection Information</u>

A Multidisciplinary Selection Committee (MSC) consisting of specialized teacher(s), district administrator(s) and coordinator(s), and school psychologist(s) trained in the interpretation of assessment results will convene to review all data and make final selection decisions based on multiple objective criteria.

Data collected may include, but are not limited to:

- Ability test scores:
 - o Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) 7
 - Verbal, Quantitative, Non-Verbal
 - Provided in student's native language if possible
 - o WISC-V or other tests used as part of an IEP process
- Achievement test scores:
 - o iReady scores
 - o SBA data
 - o Common grade level assessments

Items that can support placement in program, but cannot exclude a student (RCW 28A.300), may include but are not limited to:

- Rating scales, recommendations
- Report cards, student work samples
- Portfolio of evidence

Overall Referral & Testing Timeline

2nd Grade: All students complete a universal screening using CogAT 7 online BY 2/18/2022

All other grade levels: Students referred by family or self BY 12/10/2021

•2nd Grade: Multidisciplinary Selection Committee (MSC) meets to review screening data

- •All other grade levels: MSC reviews all referrals and data collected/provided by 2/23/2022
- Permission forms sent to families of those identified for further testing, DUE BACK 3/11/2022
- Students with parent permission complete full CogAT 7 test 3/14/2022 3/25/2022
- MSC meets to review all data and finalize program placement by 3/28/2022
- Appeals DUE BACK BY 4/14/2022
- Program placement permission forms due back by 4/22/2022

Appeals: MSC reconvenes to review data and additional evidence if provided by 4/19/2022

Appeals are considered annually for students who did not meet the criteria. The Multidisciplinary Selection Committee will examine provided evidence of high ability and need for program placement. Parents must complete and return the appeals form mailed with the notification of non-identification and return it to Wendy Clark, Highly Capable Program Coordinator, before April 14, 2022.

Transfer Students

Students who transfer from out-of-district and have qualified for Highly Capable/Gifted Program services will not be automatically enrolled as Highly Capable. Test scores and placement letters from the previous district may be used for placement consideration as long as they meet West Valley's placement criteria. A fall testing opportunity will be available for previously identified students transferring in over the summer. Parents will need to mark the appropriate sections in the registration packets, and provide documentation of prior identification.

Washington State definition of Highly Capable

Highly capable students are students who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences, or environments. (RCW 392-170-035)
